Participants who complete the training will be given a Project DAWN kit containing Narcan, a face shield, gloves, instructions, and local referral information.

What is Project DAWN?

Project DAWN is a community-based drug overdose education and Naloxone/Narcan distribution program. Participants attend a short training to learn to:

- Learn the signs and symptoms of an overdose
- Know the different types of overdoses
- Do chest compressions
- Call emergency medical services (911)
- Give the intranasal Naloxone/Narcan

What is Naloxone/Narcan?

Naloxone/Narcan is a medication that can reverse an overdose from an opioid drug. It reverses the effects of opioids on the brain and restores breathing in order to prevent death.
